“What’s the Governor’s Role in Collective Bargaining?”

Neil Abercrombie, a democratic candidate for governor, will discuss his view of the governor’s role in public employee collective bargaining and well as the governor’s role, if any, in private sector bargaining. Should the governor simply endorse the public employee bargaining results or should the governor be actively involved at the table particularly at the latter stages? If, in the private sector, the parties reach an impasse, is there a role for the governor or is it strictly hands off?

This is an opportunity to hear what one candidate is thinking about collective bargaining in Hawaii.

Neil served 21 years in Congress. He served as the Chairman of the Armed Services Subcommittee on Air and Land Forces and he was a senior member on the Natural Resources Committee. Prior to Congress, Neil was elected to the Hawaii State House and Hawaii State Senate as well as the Honolulu City Council. Neil’s holds both a Master’s degree and PhD from the University of Hawaii.
